#### 'Blanket Permission'

In a bid to cut down on the amount of time spent sending out letters and collecting in permission slips for various outings, trips and events we will be asking you to fill out a form giving the school permission to take your child out of school for the academic year 2017-18.

This will enable the teachers and TAs to take the children out of school without repeatedly sending out consent letters. We will still inform you of all trips and events in advance but we will not need you to sign a form each time. There are 3 options on the form:

- 1. **Full Blanket Permission:** You can choose to give blanket permission for your child to attend all school trips and visits (excluding residential trips) throughout the academic year 2017-18
- 2. **Partial Blanket Permission:** You can choose to give blanket permission for local trips which do not require transport, but receive a letter which requires you to fill out a consent form for trips which require transport.
- 3. **No Blanket Permission:** You can choose to opt out of giving blanket permission and request that every time your child attends a trip or event you are sent a letter, which requires you to fill out a consent form.

\*If you choose either option 2 or 3, **please ensure you send consent within 2 days of it being requested**, even if the trip or event is a week or more away, this helps us avoid spending unnecessary amounts of time chasing up responses.

We will be sending home a paper copy of the form today along with the emailed version.

Please can we ask you to return the forms promptly so we can begin the new academic year with all permissions in place.
