Is my child entitled to Pupil Premium Funding?

Children are entitled to free school meals and therefore **Pupil Premium Allocation**, if their parents qualify for the following benefits:

- Income Support.
- Income based job seekers allowance (not contribution based.)
- Income related Employee and Support Allowance. (Not contribution based)
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of no more than £16,190 (as shown on your award letter from the inland revenue— TC602.)
- Guarantee element of the State Pension Credit.
- Support via part VI of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Looked after Children Premium is allocated to any child recorded as looked after by the local authority for at least one day in the allocated school year.

Service Child Premium is allocated for any child who has a parent in the forces, or has had in the previous 5 years.

Pupil Premium Expenditure.

We spend our pupil premium allocation in a variety of ways.

First and foremost it is there to ensure that each child who is entitled to the funding is making good academic progress and achieving outcomes at least in line with their peers.


We do this by providing additional lessons in school, additional teaching assistant support, individual homework packages and occasionally, 1-1 teaching support.

The school can also use this funding to make discretionary payments and support for things like, school trips and camps, breakfast and after school clubs, uniform, swimming and transport.

This spending is considered on an individual basis when an issue is raised either by the school, or the parent.







What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil premium is an amount of money paid to the school in order to ensure the best possible provision for pupils from ALL backgrounds.

The money is used by the school to secure educational outcomes and to ensure that no gaps exist between the performance of pupils from different backgrounds.

The pupil premium allocation is made automatically for any child recorded at school as being entitled to free school meals, being in the care of the local authority, or having a parent in the armed forces.

The school is expected to report on the impact of it's pupil premium funding in relation to it's entitled pupils progress and achievement.

How the funding works.

Pupil premium is allocated to the school in the following amounts.

Pupils in Reception to Year 6 recorded as receiving free school meals—£1320

Pupils in Reception to Year 6 recorded as being in the care of by the local authority.—£1900

Pupils in Reception to Year 6 recorded as a service child, whose parent/s are informed the armed forces.—£300
