#### Year 1 Beach School

Year 1 were fabulously lucky with the weather for Beach School over at Rock on Monday. The children walked into town and caught the ferry over to Rock where they applied beach life to the curriculum. For Maths they explored the 5 times tables using stones, grouping them into 5s and building towers. For their Speaking & Listening skills they were sent on a beach hunt to look for something a fisherman might have left behind, something nature left behind, 10 things that were once on a tree and then presented their findings to the rest of the class. For Geography they pointed out landmarks, and talked about the estuary, river and sea and where they meet. They also talked about plastic pollution, did a beach clean and made posters about the issue.



### Lifecycles

The Reception Class have a nature station where they are observing the lifecycle of butterflies. There are 4 stages in a butterfly's lifecycle: 1. Eggs 2. Caterpillar (Larva) 3. Chrysalis (Pupa) 4. Butterfly. At the moment they are observing stage 2. The caterpillars are busy munching lots of food and growing, ready for stage 3 which is the resting stage. The caterpillar makes a chrysalis and will cocoon itself away before emerging as a butterfly.
