








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## Headteacher's Newsletter - October 2018

### Dear Parents / Carers

I often talk of my pride at being the school's Head of School and, as we hurtle towards the end of this half term, I have been thinking about the many great achievements we have accomplished as a community over the last three and a half terms as we continue to improve our amazing school.

We have been impressed to see how well the children have settled into their new school year and new classes. Every adult has commented on how the children are demonstrating their best learning, behaviour and attitude. We couldn't be prouder of your children or our school.

### KS2 National Curriculum results:

This year's results reflected the hard work and commitment of the Y6 children and all the adults who worked and supported them, especially Mr Anderson.

This year's results of 60% of our children achieving Expected or above in reading, writing and maths demonstrate the progress the school are making compared to the 2017 figure of 37% and 2016 figure of 47%.

As we continue to implement and embed changes to our school, we are aware that every change is not about satisfying Ofsted or other external agencies; it is about meeting our vision of providing the best for your children within a framework of challenge and high expectations for all.

### Staffing:

We could not provide the best for your children without the amazing staff here at Padstow. Every day, they go above and beyond for the children at Padstow School. Our children are very lucky to have such a dedicated, professional and steadfast team working towards securing the absolute best for your children. Despite the huge changes and challenges we have faced and still face this year, the staff at the school have made sure that your children and our families have not been affected.

Our new Y5 teacher, Mr Emery, has joined our teaching team. Mr Emery is an extremely experienced teacher and has joined us from Treverbyn Academy. The children and families in his class have made him feel very welcome and he is excited by the year ahead. Mr Emery already has some great ideas for both his class and the school.

Mrs Bruce has joined the team in Y1 and has also been made to feel very welcome by the children and their families. Mrs Bruce is very enthusiastic about joining us at Padstow and determined that her time here will be a success.

We are also very lucky to have had 4 additions to our skilled teaching assistant team, Mrs Beaumont, Mrs Nelmes, Mrs Osborne and, most recently, Mr Hardy. They all bring a vast wealth of different experiences and skills and have settled very quickly into their new posts.

#### Trips and Visits:

On each trip or visit we take the children, we are always so proud of the children for the behaviour and attitude to the learning that is taking place. Your children are a real credit to you and us.

On Monday this week, the Y5 children visited Bodmin Jail and the Y6 visited the War Museum; both to enhance the topic work being undertaken in the classrooms. All adults accompanying these trips were impressed by the behaviour of the children and the enthusiasm with which they asked questions and showed real interest in what they were learning.

On Wednesday this week, the School Councillors went to join the school councillors of Mawgan-in-Pydar and Summercourt on a beach clean as part of a Working Today for a Better Tomorrow project. Both Mrs Edwards and Mrs Green who accompanied them stated that the behaviour of the children was outstanding and that as representatives of the school, they did the school proud.

Friends of Padstow School (FOPS) - now known as the Parents, Teachers and Friends of Padstow School (PTFA) to reflect the involvement of the whole school community in any fund raising enterprise. Without the amazing efforts of the members of FOPS and many others last year, the school would not now be the proud owners of 30 new Chromebooks and a recharging trolley.
