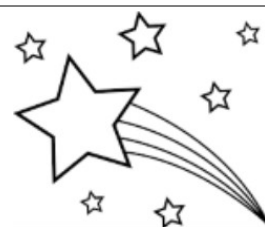
Mrs Whitford's Certificates
