Science- Enchanted Woodland Weekly project

Science - Living or dead

Identify and classify. Sort items collected from their woodland walk into groups of living things, dead things and things that have never been alive. Explain why they have sorted them in that way and think of other things that could be added to these groups.

Art - Salt dough (recipe attached)

Science - Nests and dens

Using your research to help you, I would like you to build nests and dens outdoors for woodland animals, using sticks, twigs and other collected items from the outdoors.

Use a range of natural materials, such as straw, wool, twigs, sticks, pebbles, pinecones and leaves, to create transient art. For inspiration, look at the work of the artist, <u>Andy Goldsworthy</u>.









Mindfulness

Explain to your child that sometimes when we think about new situations, or when we know things are going to change, it can make us feel worried. Feeling anxious or worried is normal; it's a step our body takes to make sure we are safe.

There are techniques we can use to help us feel calm, even when things are changing or when times are difficult. Today we will learn one of these techniques. It's all about using your superpowers! Stand in a quiet space with your legs slightly apart, your back straight and your head tall, with your arms bent and your hands on your hips. Make your position big and strong. Just like Superman or Wonder Woman might stand!

Keep still in this position and start to take long, slow breaths. You can even think about which power you would like to have to help you through the difficult time by saying things like 'I am brave' or 'I am strong'. Notice how you feel after spending a few moments in this big, strong position.


Try it anytime you are feeling worried or nervous... it will really help you to feel brave!



Get Seeds



You can get seeds from you local garden centers and store or online.

Get a Bottle





Wash any left over residue from the container if it is not a water bottle



Cut the bottle in half or cut it 2/3 botton and 1/3 top, Using a drill or a hot nail gun, make a few holes towards the bottom or at the bottom of the container

Plant Seeds



fill the bottom part with your seed starter mix (how to make an inexpensive seed starter mix) Depending on the seeds and how many seeds or containers you have, Plant between 1 to 4 seeds. I usually do 2, so that the seeds have room to grow. water the mix inside

the container.

Seedling care



If you put holes towards the bottom of the container, that area below the hole will act as a water reservoir so you don't have to water that often but if you have holes at the bottom you have to check it regularly so it does not dry up.

After Planting



Put the container in a warm area, once the seeds germinate move them to where there is sunlight like a window in a warm room or under a grow light



Salt Dough

Playdough Recipe

You will need

Food colouring (optional) 2 cups flour I cup water 1 cup salt

Method

- Mix together the flour and salt in a large mixing bowl.
- 2. If desired, add 5-10 drops of food colouring to 1 cup of water.
- Sir the water into the flour and salt in the large bowf. eń
- Roll out the dough on a flat surface and knead it together. It should be soft and pliable.
- Make models and ornaments. ú
- The dough can be left to air dry or dried in a low oven 120-150°C. The time the dough takes to dry will depend on the size and thickness of your creations.
