Children will learn about the rise, life, achievements and eventual end of each civilisation.</p> <p>Enquiry Questions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Who were the ancient Egyptians?</li> <li>What makes a civilisation?</li> <li>What /who is a Pharaoh and why are they significant?</li> <li>How did significant Sumerian inventions change the way people lived?</li> </ul>				<p>Skills and knowledge project revises the features of Earth, time zones and lines of latitude and longitude to pinpoint places on a map. Children find out more about map scales, grid references, contour lines and map symbols.
