
Snowflake the Attendance Owl is again awarded to Lapwing class who have achieved full attendance this week!

Christmas Lunch, Wednesday 16th December

A reminder that if you received an email from the school on Thursday last week regarding updating the consents you give for us to take and share images of your child, we need you to please log into Arbor (either via the App, if you have it, or their website <u>https://login.arbor.sc/</u>) and you will see the 6 image-use statements on the front page, under 'notices'. Click on each one in turn and tap 'consent' or 'decline' as you wish—this will only take 30 seconds once you are logged in! If you are unable to access Arbor then please ring the school and we can talk you through the statements and get verbal consent. **Please complete this TODAY if you haven't done so already. Thank you to the many parents who have now confirmed their consent status.** (Parents with children in Puffin or Lapwing class or children who have joined the school this academic year do not need to re-submit their consents for those children).
