Breaking News!

We are incredibly lucky to have had the funds for this raised for the school and in a relatively short period of time. An amazing achievement!

This new space will give us a focus for extending our outdoor learning opportunities. In addition to contributing to academic learning, outdoor learning activities can also improve problem-solving skills, thinking skills and teamwork.

The children will be able to watch the new 'gazebo' being built.

The build should not impact on the flow of the one-way system other than the following:

Parents are requested to ensure their children walk with them on route to their classroom and to not run ahead.

Parents needing to take younger children to the Pre-School will need to go through the double gates onto the playground opposite Lapwing Class and not down the curved walkway. Return by walking back through the same gates, turning left as before and leaving via the one-way system as usual.

Kittiwake class investigating hand-washing

Kittiwake class were experimenting this week: They found that when soap was on your finger the pepper moved towards the edges of the bowl. This is because the soap removes the oils on your hands and the oil pushes the pepper towards the edge of the bowl. Microbes like to stick to the oils on your hands, which is why we wash our hands with soap. Without soap, the oils are not removed, and microbes find it easier to stick!
