Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back to year 1. I hope you had a fun summer break and are now ready for the start of the school year.

This term our topic is called 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers' and we will be learning about all sorts of animals. We will be investigating the differences between them, how to care for them and meeting some amazing animals along the way. Please see the attached topic web.

Below there is some information about Year 1 and some ideas about helping your child at home.

Phonics

In June, Y1 have their phonics screening check so they will continue with Read Write Inc with daily phonic sessions. We will be sending out information regarding which sounds they are learning throughout the year. It would really benefit the children if you could recap these sounds as regularly as you can. It really is the foundation to becoming fluent readers and writers.

Reading

All children will have chance to choose a book to share and read with you each day. You can change these as often as you feel necessary. All reading should be recorded in their Reading Record books, please also write in here any other home reading you might share.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term we are learning all about 'Place Value'. We will be reading, writing and counting backwards and forwards from any number 0-10, one more or less than a number, comparing numbers (<>, greater, fewer, less, more) and ordering numbers. During the second part of this half term we will be working on our number bonds to 10 using both addition and subtraction.
