#### SongFest

You may have noticed on your child's Home Learning platforms that their teachers have been talking about **SongFest** and asking them to practice singing specific songs at home. The finale event is a virtual concert, being held on Zoom, on the afternoon of Wednesday 17th March 2021. Nearer the time we will send out a letter with the joining information if your child wishes to participate.
