Tuesday- What is mass/weight?


Can you make your own balance scales?

How many pieces of pasta/pebbles/dried beans heavy is the spoon? Is the knife heavier or lighter?



How many spoon scoops went into..... ?



Listen carefully.



You could do a little bar model or a tally.





The Fox and the Owl



In the big, green wood, was an owl and a fox.




The owl and fox wished to be king. All of the animals gathered together to pick a king.
