This will ensure you go to the correct page on the learning websites, rather than just typing AR into your search bar, for example.

TOP TIPS

Top Tips for everyday Maths at home:

Here are a few ideas from White Rose Maths of activities you can do at home with your child to help with their maths, without it seeming like a maths lesson:

- **Estimation jars**

Take a clear jar or box and fill it with lots of different items e.g. toy cars, sweets, coins, dried pasta, wax crayons, cereal, anything you have around the house that can fit in a jar. Children can then estimate how many items they think are in the jar or they can fill them and challenge parents to guess. Once the estimation has been made, count the objects to see how close you were.

- **Card games**

There are Card game ideas on the White Rose Maths website to play at home:

- Number bonds match (for KS1 children)
- Times table blast (for KS2 children)

- **Cooking & baking**

Weighing out ingredients or using multiplication or division to vary the quantities used to make bigger / smaller batches gets children thinking about maths in a practical way.

- **Treasure hunt**

Create a treasure hunt & ask children to think about the route around the house. Some clues could have maths challenges in them.

- **Minute madness**

How many star jumps can you do in a minute? How many times can you write your name in a minute? How many socks can you get into a washing basket in a minute? Just three possible challenges you could set using a countdown timer.
