Year 5 visit to a Cornish art project on Bodmin Moor


Our Year 5 pupils had an interesting visit on Wednesday. They travelled to Bodmin Moor to visit the site of Kerdroya, a major new piece of permanent public art. At the site near Colliford Lake is a 56 metre diameter classical labyrinth being built of Cornish stone hedging.



It isn't open to the public until it is finished, but our group were lucky enough to watch the craftsmen at work and bury time capsules at the site.

Oystercatcher class learning about plastic pollution

The children learnt about marine conservation and designed posters to educate people about plastic pollution. Social media and online abuse

The NSPCC has released figures on online abuse on social media. The figures, drawn from responses from 35 police forces across the UK on the platforms used to commit sexual offences or indecent image offences against children, show that Facebook-owned apps were used in more than 52% of the instances where the means of communication was recorded for online child crimes, with one third of all instances on Instagram and another 13% on Facebook and Messenger.
