REMINDER: Proposal for closure of Wadebridge Leisure Centre

A reminder of the information given in last week's newsletter: GLL, the social enterprise that run many of the leisure centres in Cornwall, has asked Cornwall Council to allow them to stop operating the leisure centres in Wadebridge, Launceston, Saltash and Falmouth, and the hydrotherapy pool within St Austell leisure centre or, alternatively, to subsidise the operation of these facilities.

Cornwall Council have made it clear that they do not have the finances to subsidise the leisure centres, so unless local communities can propose a viable solution, they will close.

Wadebridge Leisure Centre is a vital local facility, used by sports clubs, schools and local families, and it would be a huge blow to this area if we lost it. Cornwall Council are asking for residents' views on the planned closures, so click on link below if you wish to participate in the consultation:

Census day: Thursday 7th October

Thursday next week is a National School Census Day when the Dept for Education collects information about each school to help them plan and set school budgets for the future. One of the figures we must report is the number of Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 children eating a Universal Free School Meal that day. This data is then used to decide how much funding for the year we will receive for our hot meals. This means that if a child in those year groups does <u>not</u> have a meal on Thursday, we will not receive any further funding for the rest of the year. Therefore, on Thursday next week we will be inviting every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the hot meal that day—the menu that day is a choice of chicken fajita or mixed bean fajita with rice salad & Mexican slaw, or jacket potato. If you would still like to send a packed lunch into school as a back-up, then please do so.

Curlew class' modelling

As part of their 'tomb building' topic this half term looking at how ancient Egyptians lived, Curlew class have been using their creative skills. They used air-drying clay to make tablets into which they have carved their names in hieroglyphs. They also built models to replicate the structures that ancient Egyptians would have used to transport water from the River Nile to irrigate their fields.
