Change of Menu—Thursday 20th May

Thursday next week is National School Census Day when the Dept for Education collects information about each school to help them plan and set school budgets for the future. One of the figures we must report is the number of Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 children eating a Universal Free School Meal that day. This data is then used to decide how much funding for the year we will receive for our hot meals. This means that if a child in those year groups does <u>not</u> have a meal on Thursday, we will not receive any further funding for the rest of the year. If your child chooses to have a meal on another day, we will have to fund this from our school budget. Therefore, on Thursday next week we will be encouraging every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the hot meal that day. If you would still like to send a packed lunch into school as a back-up, then please do so.
